

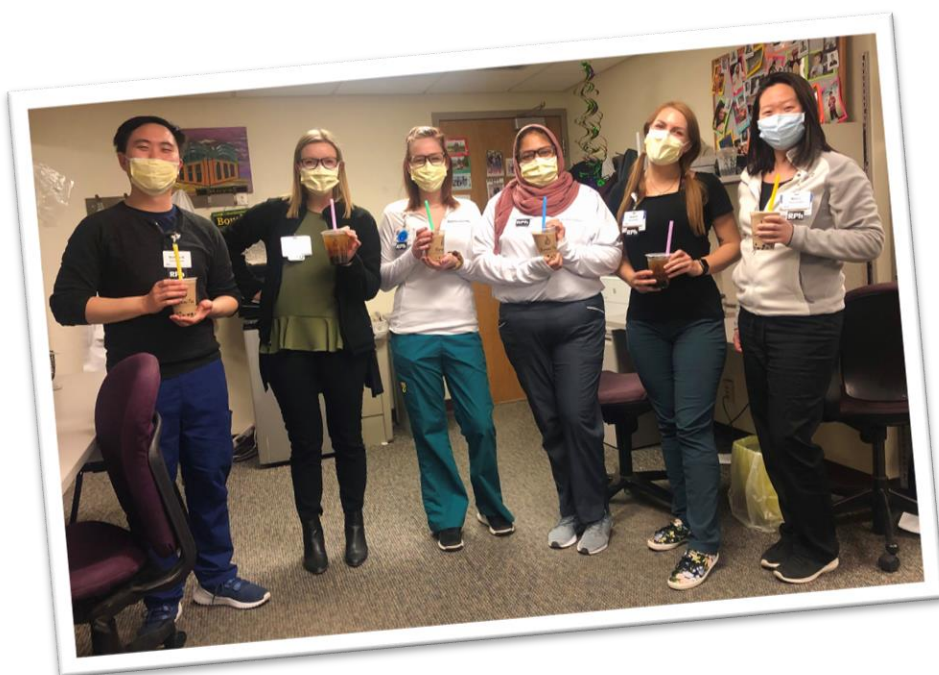


OFFICE MEMORIES!



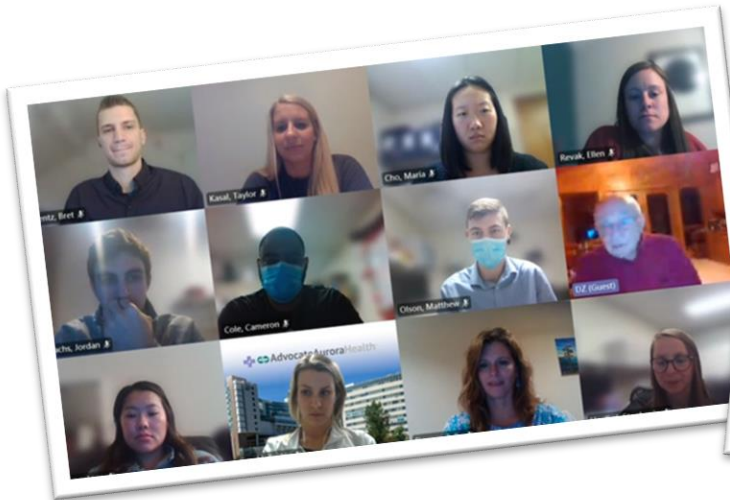

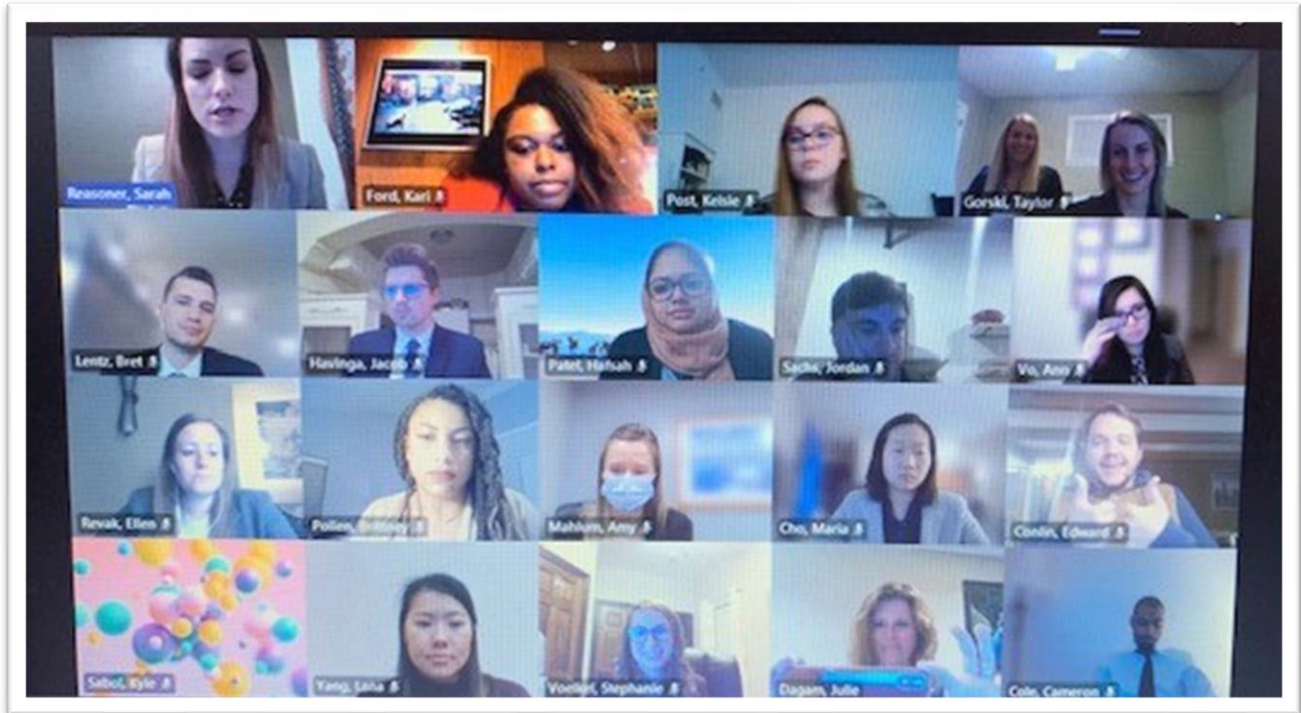
ADOPT A FAMILY

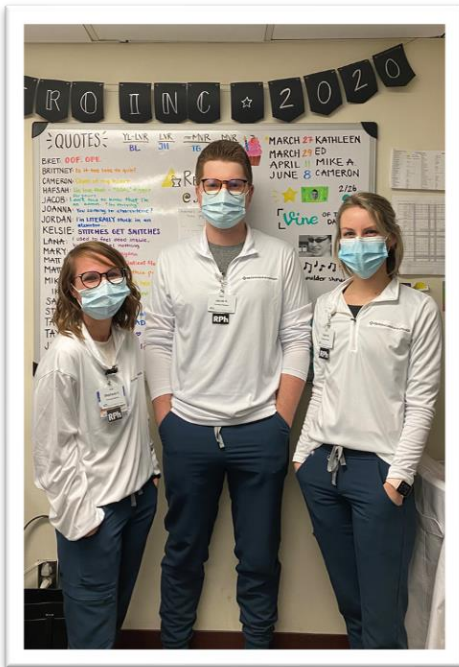
ASHP MIDYEAR CLINICAL MEETING



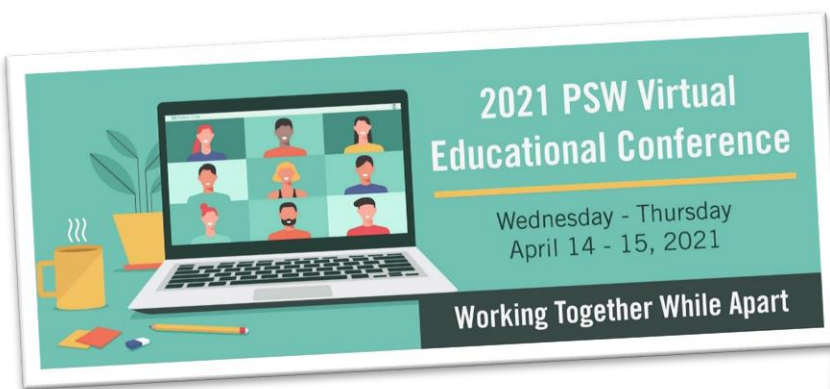

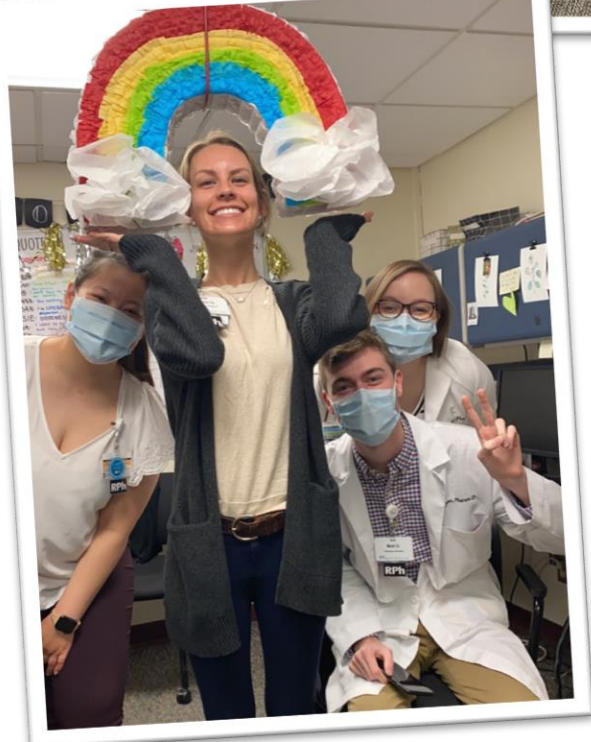
